The president opened the meeting at 7:30 PM, 20 present.

We discussed upcoming events. Usually the club hosts a BBQ in May as a fundraiser for Field Day in June. The last few BBQ's have been sparsely attended and not been moneymakers. The treasurer stated that we had sufficient funds to pay for Field Day as of now. The club voted to cancel this year's BBQ in May, and tabled further discussion of whether we should permanently cancel the May BBQ.

The next PG&E Siren test is scheduled for Aug 19, 2006. In times past we have assisted them, and PG&E paid the club a small fee for helping. As of yet, we have yet to receive last year's payment. (This just in- they paid! –ed) It apparently has gotten lost in the vast PG&E bureaucracy, but club members have been actively pursuing it.

The club's Fish Fry is scheduled for Saturday, Sep 16, 2006. More to follow...

Field Day preparations are proceeding. Larry, W7CB is the head honcho for the Field Day activities. We are going to occupy our Field Day site at the Paso Robles Fairground from early afternoon Friday, 23 June 2006 until about lunchtime, Sunday June 25, 2006. The fairground is reserved and paid for. We received our traditional special event call sign of W6T. The club discussed other preparations at length.

In Feb 2006, the club made a donation to Handi-Ham, a non-profit organization that helps disabled people be amateur radio operators. They were kind enough to send the club a very kind thank you letter that was read at the meeting.



Note that this race is relatively long, and conducted over rural rugged terrain not well served by repeaters, so in some cases event communications were only possible by using mobile HF rigs.

#### **Amateur Radio Towers in SLO County**

I wanted to share a positive experience that I had at the SLO County Planning and Building Department with respect to installation of an amateur radio tower.

Jane and I currently have three Rohn 55 towers that we installed back in 2000 that have all sorts of Force 12 antennas on them from 80 m to 6 m.

We live in unincorporated SLO County, so the jurisdiction for building permits and zoning regulations is SLO County. At that time, I received an over-the-counter building permit for the towers for a cost of \$73. (Nice number).

A month ago, Larry W7CB offered me the remainder of his Rohn 45 tower, and being the infrastructure builder that I am, I drove out and loaded up!

This week, I prepared the application for permit, drove to SLO and purchased the permit. This time it was \$144 but still a simple process.

I am very familiar with the SLO County ordinance relating to installation of towers and would be happy to assist anyone in the permit process in the County jurisdiction. It is a small matter to permit a 50' amateur radio tower!
