Presidential Ramblings:

For anyone who hasn't heard, amateur radio played a big public service role following the December earthquake. Not unexpectedly, landline and cellular telephone services were down from the quake. (Actually, all carriers at Radio Ranch remained in operation following the 'quake, but they were overloaded with traffic. – ed.) SLOECC activated several Emergency Communications Centers (ECC) including the relatively new facility at the Public Safety Center. Traffic handled by hams was instrumental in coordinating the Red Cross Shelters and feeding the troops who responded from around the State. Communications over the grade to the ECC at Red Cross Headquarters in San Luis was accomplished through the Tassajara Peak VHF repeater. Too many PRARC hams participated to adequately recognize them here. Hopefully, stories of their contributions will unfold throughout the year.

The Paso ECC operation was noticed by Sheriff Pat Hedges N6SSG and George Brown KF6PBL of County OES who stuck their heads when things calmed down. The ARRL webpage had the story within days of the event and I suspect a QST article will appear before too long.

We did finally get through election of club officers at the February meeting and need to recognize the contributions of our outgoing President Bill McFarlen WA5VGI, Vice President Tim Haueter W6NS and Newsletter Editor Mike Kelley K6AJ. Bill will be around, but Tim is now retired and will be splitting his time with us in SLO County. Mike has relocated out of the area and will surely be missed for his contributions to the newsletter and Field Day. Please remember to thank them personally if you get the chance
